The questions appear to be rhetorical, and still God insists on Job's response. Have you endured an encounter with someone that has left you speechless and silent? This is what we witness between God and Job. Yes, it is awkward, but it is a reckoning of sorts that is key to Job's future.

Next Week: The conclusion of the "Mystery" series contains Job's answer. He responds in humility and admits his fault. He "sees" God and knows just how much he must confess. Job's fortunes are eventually "restored," and he dies after a long life. Bob Kiederling brings the series to a close.
