What's up in worship?

Today: Following up with part two, Epiphany shows us where to find Jesus; that is, how God has been working in our lives before we even realize it — or following the star in terms of a new direction God wants us to take; or following the star in terms of discernment. What decision, new project, new relationship or adjustment do we need to follow through on that will ultimately bring honor to the name of Christ?

Next Week: God's plan for the church calls for each member of the Body of Christ to play a vital role. Sometimes we think that serving God is an obligation, a duty, and that it isn't meant to be enjoyable. The truth is, though, that God wants us to find joy and fulfillment when we serve. That happens when we serve in a role that matches who God created us to be. In this sermon series starting January 13th titled Serving from the Heart, we'll take a 7-week journey of worship and self-discovery as we learn more about how the Body of Christ is intended to function, and what that means to each person.
